The first paragraph will be from the author’s point of view and the second paragraph will be from the student’s point of view. The report must have a cover sheet; including Title of the book, the author and the student’s name. **** (Extra Points Will Be Given For Typed Reports And A Creative Cover Sheet Design).**
